AREMELIA: (II 4-1) A strong-willed woman who is unafraid to share her thoughts. She is confident and at ease in her body

NELL: (II 4 – 1) Confident and charming. A knowledgeable woman of the world

CHARLAINE: A sweet, young lady. Very innocent.
